AFG PROGRAMS.



We serve young women engaged in sex work as well as victims/survivors of sex trafficking and domestic violence.

Available by phone, web chat, and on-site to assist individuals with:

- » The transition into safer situations
- » Maintaining long-term stability
- » Reconnecting with supportive family members (when possible)

Prevention

We work with at-risk girls in Kindergarten through 12th grade from the immediate southwest Detroit community.

Activities and curriculum designed to:

- » Increase self-esteem
- » Build leadership skills
- » Strengthen educational outcomes and college readiness





Shelter/Transitional Living Program (TIL)

Once a homeless young woman enters our shelter, AFG staff immediately work with her to evaluate her needs and develop an individualized plan with clear goals.

- » Specifically targets 15-24 year old young women, filling an important gap of services in Detroit
- » Licensed to house young children of residents who are 18 years or older
- » The children of residents have access to our Early Childhood Education Center

Housing Stability

Funded through the Department of Housing and Urban Development, services are designed to move individuals and young families experiencing homelessness into safe housing with rental, utility assistance, and supportive services. The goal is to:

- » Provide the advocacy and support necessary to maintain stability
- » Avert another crisis once in their own home
